

**TOWN OF GRANBY

PUBLIC HEARING  
MINUTES  
JUNE 1, 2012**

The Public Hearing of the Charter Revision Commission 2011 was called to order by Chairman Francis Brady at 7:00 p.m.

Chairman Brady opened the hearing and read the legal notice as published in the ***Hartford Courant and the town's website May 22, 2012.*** The Charter Revision Commission has called for a second Public Hearing for the purpose of hearing public comment regarding the Town of Granby draft Charter Report.

Many comments were said differently but essentially most residents want to see an automatic referendum for the annual town budget. Some indicated that the town is well managed. One resident made his comment that the annual town budget procedure is a good and acceptable way to approve the budget. He remembered when private school education far exceeded the public school education for our children and it took this town several years to achieve our status

quo with the three boards working together and creating the budget. Mr. Glenney presented a petition supplement and advised that he now has 1,400 signatures in support of a direct referendum.
