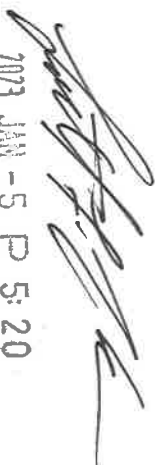

I. CALL MEETING TO ORDER

Temporary Chairman, Mark Lockwood called the regular meeting of the Charter Revision Commission to order at 6:05 p.m.

II. PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Temporary Chairman, Mark Lockwood led members of the Charter Revision Commission in the Pledge of Allegiance.

III. ADOPTION OF MINUTES OF PREVIOUS MEETINGS

Temporary Chairman, Mark Lockwood reminded members of the Charter Revision Commission and members of the public that this being the first meeting of the Charter Revision Commission that there were no previous Charter Revision Commission meeting minutes to approve.

IV. UNFINISHED BUSINESS

No unfinished business took place.

V. NEW BUSINESS

A. Election of Charter Revision Commission Chairperson

Temporary Chairman, Mark Lockwood informed members of the Charter Revision Commission that a permanent Chairperson of the Charter Revision Commission should be voted on for the purposes

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of conducting the meetings. Temporary Chairman, Mark Lockwood opened the floor for nominations of a permanent Chairperson.

Commissioner Benjamin Perron moved for the adoption of the following nomination:

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Granby Charter Revision Commission hereby appoints Commissioner Edward Ohannessian as permanent Chairman of the Charter Revision Commission for the duration of the Charter Revision Commission period.

The motion was seconded by Commissioner Anthony Cappelli. After receiving no other nominations for Chairmanship of the Charter Revision Commission the motion passed by a unanimous voice vote (9/0/0) **MOTION CARRIES**.

At 6:07 p.m. after the motion carried, Temporary Chairman, Mark Lockwood stepped down as Temporary Chairman of the Charter Revision Commission, and Chairman Edward Ohannessian presided over the remainder of the meeting agenda.

B. Election of Charter Revision Commission Vice-Chairperson

Chairman Edward Ohannessian informed members of the Charter Revision Commission that a permanent Vice-Chairperson of the Charter Revision Commission should be voted on for the purposes of conducting the meetings in the absence of the Chairman. Chairman Edward Ohannessian opened the floor for nominations of a Vice-Chairperson.

Commissioner Anthony McGovern moved for the adoption of the following nomination:

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Granby Charter Revision Commission hereby appoints Commissioner Anthony McGovern as permanent Vice-Chairman of the Charter Revision Commission for the duration of the Charter Revision Commission period.

The motion was seconded by Commissioner Benjamin Perron. After receiving no other nominations for Vice-Chairmanship of the Charter Revision Commission the motion passed by a unanimous voice vote. (9/0/0) **MOTION CARRIES**.

C. Review of Charter Revision Commission Regular Meeting Schedule

Chairman Edward Ohannessian informed members of the Charter Revision Commission that a regular meeting schedule needed to be on file with the Town Clerk's office per Connecticut State General Statute and that the Charter Revision Commission needed to decide when their meetings would take place. D. Review of Board of Selectmen Charge to Members of the Charter Revision Commission

First Selectmen Mark Fiorentino took an opportunity to thank members of the Charter Revision Commission for their service to the Town of Granby and their wiliness to help revise our Town Charter. First Selectmen Mark Fiorentino also informed members of the Charter Revision Commission that the Board of Selectmen was giving the charge to consider such revisions to the Granby Town Charter Commission as they deemed appropriate and to submit a report of their recommendations to the Board of Selectmen in sufficient time for the proposed charter revision question(s) to be placed on the November 7, 2023, Election Ballot; and in order to meet this schedule, a draft report will be due to the Board of Selectmen before May 20, 2023; and Charge the Charter Revision Commission to consider any matter deemed appropriate by the Commission to clarify or improve the Charter or to reflect changes in law or procedures which may have occurred since the last Charter revision.

E. Review of Charter Revision Commission Timeline & Deadlines

Chairman Edward Ohannessian reminded members of the Charter Revision Commission that several of the dates in the Charter Revision Commission were subject to change and some are not. Chairman Edward Ohannessian asked Scott Nolan, Town Clerk to help revise the Charter Revision Commission Timeline & Deadlines document and have it prepared for the next meeting as some of the dates have already been affected due to the setting of a regular meeting schedule.

Chairman Edward Ohannessian asked that the Town Staff send a memo to all Boards and Commissions to solicit feedback regarding recommendations and proposed changes to the Town Charter and respectfully requested that all feedback is due back to the Charter Revision Commission by Friday, January 20, 2023.

F. Resolution Setting a Time and Place for a Public Hearing to Receive Citizen Input on Charter Revision Items

Chairman Edward Ohannessian reminded members of the Charter Revision Commission that Connecticut General Statute requires that an initial public hearing be held to receive citizen input regarding the Town Charter.

Pursuant to the foregoing notice, Chairman Edward Ohannessian called the Charter Revision Commission Public Hearing to order on Thursday, January 12, 2023, at 6:15 p.m. in the Town Hall Meeting Room of the Granby Town Hall, 15 North Granby Road, Granby, Connecticut to receive citizen input and solicit feedback on the Granby Town Charter for the purposes of revision.

Scott A. Nolan, Town Clerk read the call of the public hearing after which, Chairman Edward Ohannessian opened the floor for public comment.

PUBLIC COMMENT

Paul R. Willis, Republican Registrar of Voters addressed members of the Charter Revision Commission regarding section 10-5(c) "Machine Voting" of the Granby Town Charter in which a recommendation from the Registrars of Voters will be forthcoming to address the language of that section due to a conflict with possible back-to-back voting events. Mr. Willis further explained that back-to-back voting events can be problematic as it can be challenging to staff the polling locations with volunteers when they are needed multiple days in a row. Mr. Willis also noted that this will be the case in 2028, 2032, and 2036 and that revising this section might make a lot of sense. Mr. Willis explained that both Registrars of Voters were working on drafting language that could be added to the Town Charter to help avoid back-to-back voting events.

There being no more public wishing to speak before the hearing, Chairman Edward Ohannessian declared the Public Hearing closed at 6:20 p.m.

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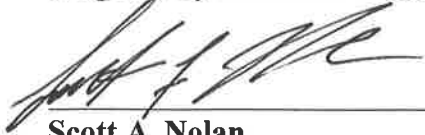

IV. NEW BUSINESS

A. Review of Public Hearing

Chairman Edward Ohannessian thanked Paul Willis, Registrar of Voters for his feedback and noted that he felt it was important that the Charter Revision Commission review the feedback and take a look at possibly revising that schedule.

Chairman Edward Ohannessian inquired about whether or not the Town had received any feedback using the Charter@Granby-ct.gov email address at which time Town Manager, Erica Robertson noted that the only feedback received to date was from the Registrar of Voters office. Town Manager, Erica Robertson also noted that the deadline for feedback was January 20, 2023, and that we would be compiling the feedback submitted and sharing it with members of the Charter Revision Commission at their next meeting.

Chairman Edward Ohannessian inquired if the Connecticut Conference of Municipalities (CCM) had any opinion on "hot topics" that are currently affecting town charters and asked Town Manager, Erica Robertson, to reach out to CCM and find out as much as she can about Charter Revision topics.

Chairman Edward Ohannessian inquired with members of the Charter Commission if they felt the current meeting room setup was conducive to a working environment. After a brief discussion, the Charter Commission decided, they would like to meet at tables to have more of a round table discussion.

Chairman Edward Ohannessian asked members of the Charter Revision Commission what they felt were the topics they would like to discuss going forward and asked each member to identify areas of discussion:

Commissioner Francis Brady

- Noted that he would like to discuss the position of how the First Selectman gets elected.
- Positions of Profit as it relates to section 3-12
- Clarify the Town Manager's tenure and that there should be some clarity that the Town Manager can be removed without cause

Vice-Chairman Anthony McGovern

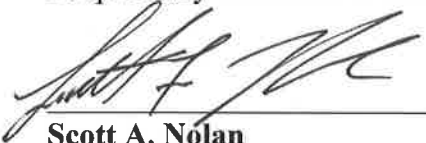
